
#### **Letter to Families**



#### Dear Families,

Welcome to the Fall 2023 quarter of *Shine: Living in God's Light*! We begin with stories from Genesis, focusing on the family of Abraham and Sarah. 

Blessings to you and your family as you explore God's story together!





#### "Calm Down" Cards


Copy and cut out the cards for use in Responsive Play (Move).



Stretch as tall as you can.


# SESSION 3 Jacob and Esau Puppets


Copy and cut apart the cards. Post them around the room at children's eye level for Responsive Play (Make Peace).

Left and right and up and down, (reach left, right, up, then down)


God goes with us.



