Teaching Aids

SESSION 1 Letter to Families

Dear Families,

Welcome to a new quarter of Shine! The quarter begins with six stories of Lent and Easter from the book of Mark in the New Testament. Your child will be learning about Jesus' last days with his friends and being raised to new life by God's power. This set of stories will be followed by seven stories of the early church from the book of Acts.

Remembering important events and people is important to these stories. They show active ways to worship God and to remember what God has done. For example, Jesus gives his friends a way to remember him when they share bread and drink from a cup during the Last Supper. (See session 3 on Mark 14:12–26.) Many churches continue this practice as an active way to remember what Jesus has done.

Developing simple traditions with your children helps them to remember what God has done, and it builds a sense of identity as children grow in faith. Try to incorporate simple rituals into your day, week, month, and year. These recurring experiences help children to feel loved and secure.

Pray Together!

Make prayer a part of your daily life.

• When you sit down together for a meal, say "Thank you" to God for the food. Sing a simple song, such as this one to the tune of "London Bridge":

God, you give us food to eat. Thank you, God! Thank you, God!

God, you give us what we need. Thank you! A-men.

• Say short prayers throughout the day. Doing so helps children to see that God cares about our daily lives. Complicated words and long speeches are not needed in order to talk to God. Simple requests for help and quick notes of praise can be part of daily life.

Share Story Time!

Story time is a powerful way to connect with your child, taking a break from multitasking and the busyness of the day to simply enjoy each other's company. Children thrive when they have ongoing, consistent opportunities to share the full attention of the adults in their lives.

- Go to a public library with your child and ask the librarian for books you can enjoy with your child.
- Tell stories, even very short ones, so that children learn more about their family. You can tell children what you remember about ways you have celebrated Easter in the past. As you share, it may spark ideas for new traditions for your family.
- Read a story from a favorite children's Bible before bed.



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SESSION 1 Leaf Template


For Responsive Play (Create), use this leaf shape as a guide for cutting out leaf shapes in sponges.




Flame Template





SESSION 3, 6–13 "Peace Path" Game Cards

Make enough copies of these mats so that each child will have one. Cover the mats with clear packaging tape or transparent shelf liner, if desired. Children use the pretzel shape on the mat as a guide to form a pretzel shape out of play dough.






Make one set of Story Circles for each child in your group for Re-play. Cut out the circles.


SESSION 5 Easter Bunting

Make a copy of these story figures for each child for use in Re-play.




SESSION 9 Prayer Wheels

Copy the Prayer Wheel circles (pages 90-91) onto stiff paper or card stock so that each child has a set of circles. Have the children color them, and then fasten the wheels together in the middle with a round-head brass fastener.




SESSION 9 Prayer Wheels (continued)

Copy the circle onto stiff paper, such as card stock if possible.




SESSION 11 Peter and Cornelius Puppets and Animal Card




SESSION 12 Boat Diagram

Provide supplies for each child to make a boat in Responsive Play (Create). Cut a paper plate in half and staple the two halves together to form the boat. Make a sail by folding a triangular piece of paper around a craft stick and fastening it with tape. Cut a slit in a toilet paper roll and stick the craft stick into this slit. Then place the toilet paper roll snugly into the paper plate boat so the sail stands up.




SESSION 13 Tent Template


Make a copy of this tent for each child in your group. Use card stock or other stiff paper if possible. Cut around the outer edge of each tent. Have children decorate their tent. Then fold the tent along the two dotted lines and fasten the edge of the blank side to the edge of the other side together with clear tape.



SESSION 13 Movement Cards

Make a copy of the cards and cut them out along the solid lines. Place them in a bowl or bag to use during the Responsive Play (Move) activity.
