#### **SESSION 1**

#### **Letter to Families**



#### Dear Families,

Welcome to the Fall 2024 quarter of Shine Curriculum. Children will explore the beauty, artistry, and majesty of God's creation. They will also learn about the prophets and leaders that God chose to guide the Israelites. Samuel and David were called by God when they were very young. Ruth and Abigail handled difficult circumstances with creativity and compassion.

Here are some ideas to extend your child's learning at home:

## **Pray Together!**

Children will learn the spiritual practice of praising God. What can your family praise God for?

Try using different names for God, such as Shepherd, Creator, or Comforter. These names can remind you of the qualities of God.

Children will also learn a hand prayer. Point to each finger as you pray in the following way:

(Touch palm.) God, we pray for all who need your love.

(Touch thumb.) Be close to our family and friends.

(Touch pointer finger.) Give our leaders wisdom and strength.

(Touch middle finger.) Comfort all those who may feel forgotten or alone.

(Touch ring finger.) Keep workers safe. Thank you for all they do.

(Touch pinky.) Thank you for creating me, knowing me, and loving me.

(Touch palm.) Let all people feel your love today. Amen.

## **Care for Creation Together**

No one likes to pick up someone else's mess, but when we show care and responsibility for our surroundings, we are also demonstrating gratitude for the world God has given us. Carry trash bags and gloves with you when you go out and put your children on "trash patrol" to spot litter in public places.

#### **Cook Together**

God provided oil and flour for a widow in Zarephath. Try making flatbread with just oil, flour, and water!


1 cup / 120 g flour (plus a little more for kneading the dough)
2 T / 30 ml olive oil
½ cup / 120 ml water

Mix the ingredients in a bowl. The dough will be moist and should hold together. Sprinkle flour on your workspace and knead the dough for about five minutes. Make small balls of dough, then roll out flat into thin circles. Place circles on a greased cookie sheet. Bake in a preheated oven at 350° F / 180° C for 20 minutes until crisp, like a cracker.



#### **Instructions:**

Lay the "Trivia Challenge" Teaching Poster on a table. Use construction paper to cover any columns you won't be using. Divide into teams of three or four people and assign a color to each team. On a turn, the team chooses a category and number of points, such as "Ruth for 400." When a team correctly answers a question, they will lay a small square of paper or a sticky note in their assigned color on the box of the question they answered. At the end, add up the number of points they received to determine a winner.

<ul> <li>ELIJAH (pages 100-101)</li> <li>200 points</li> <li>☐ How did Elijah get his food in the wilderness? (ravens brought it)</li> <li>☐ What food did the ravens bring for Elijah? (bread and meat)</li> <li>☐ Elijah was a prophet. Which king did he speak to? (King Ahab)</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>600 points</li> <li>□ What did Elijah ask the widow to give him? (a cup of water and a piece of bread)</li> <li>□ What two food items did the woman have left? (flour and oil)</li> <li>□ Why didn't the widow want to give the food to Elijah? (she only had enough for one more meal for her and her son)</li> <li>800 points</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>400 points</li> <li>□ Why did the creek dry up? (there was no rain)</li> <li>□ Why was the widow gathering sticks? (to build a fire and make one last meal)</li> <li>□ What town did the widow live in with her son? (Zarephath)</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Who ate the food the widow made? (the widow, her son, Elijah)</li> <li>What promise did God make to the widow? (the jar of flour and bottle of oil would not run out until the rain came)</li> <li>What happened when the widow made the food? (the flour and oil did not run out)</li> </ul>

## "Abigail Race" Instructions

- 1. Work together to make up a chant to explain the situation between Nabal and David. Say it to your teacher. The teacher will give you permission to move to the next activity.
- 2. Work together to draw: 5 sheep, 2 jugs of wine, 20 loaves of bread, 10 clusters of raisins, 20 fig cakes, and some grain. (*Note:* Abigail really took 200 loaves of bread, 100 clusters of raisins, and 200 fig cakes!)
- 3. One at a time, go around the room pretending to ride a donkey while carrying your drawing. Pass off the drawing to next person as he or she begins. Everyone must touch each corner of room.
- 4. As a group, bow low (touch your forehead to the ground) five times. Say "Don't fight, David!" each time you bow.

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#### **SESSION 9**

## "No Way, It's Okay" Situations

Use during Connect to Each Other.

- Your brother eats the vegetables off your plate at dinner when you aren't looking.
- · Your dad says you have to take out the trash again this week, even though it's your brother's week to do it.
- · Your friend takes your favorite book without asking.
- Your cousin gets takeout food but doesn't share any with you.
- There is money missing from your wallet. Your sister was looking in your wallet earlier, but she says she didn't take it.
- The goalie blames you when the other team scores a goal. She says you should have been a better defender.
- Two people at your table in art class spill paint. The art teacher makes you help clean it up, even though it wasn't your fault.
- · Your friend insists that you both watch a movie, but you have already seen it and did not like it.
